

In pursuance of an order of the most honorable of Cumberland County Court to us directed for the purpose of laying off and assigning to Delilah Kington late stephens her third part of the estate real and personal Peter stephens deceased agreeable to the latter clause of the said decedent's will we have met on the premises and being sworn and out of the land of said decedent we have laid off and assigned unto said Delilah fifty acres and thirty four poles bounded as follows to wit: Beginning at the beginning corner of the original survey and running north 9° west with one of the lines of said survey 1140 poles to its corner thence with another of the lines of said survey

N 81° E ⁵² poles to a stake in said line thence S 9° E 170 poles to an elm on the river bank thence down the river to the beginning it being one third part of said original survey and out of the slaves belonging to said decedent's estate we have assigned to said Delilah a negro woman named Sally valued by us to \$400 and one negro boy named Charles valued to \$50 more than one third of said slaves which said 50 dollars Nicholas Kington who July married with said Delilah assumed the payment of to the heirs of said decedent we find the amount of the value of personal property now in possession to be \$158^{cts} 25 and the amount of a former value to be 132^{cts} 27

one third part of said sum we assign to said Delilah amtⁿ \$87^{cts} 70^{cts} and in pursuance of said order we have proceeded to lay off and divide the remainder of said estate real and personal between the heirs of said Peter stephens deceased the land we have divided as follows (to wit) Lot N. 1st contains 15 3/4 acres beginning on the river bank at an elm corner to the midway third part and running thence north 9° N. to a stake in the back line of the original survey thence N 81° E. 15 poles to a stake in said line thence S 9° E to a maple on the river bank thence down the river to the beginning containing N. 2nd ^(nd) begins ere a maple on the river bank corner to N. 1st and river N 9° N to the branch line to a stake thence N 81° E 14 poles with said line to a stake thence S 9° E to a beach and sugarbush on the river bank thence down the river to the beginning

Containing $18\frac{3}{4}$ acres N. 3 Begins at a beach and sugar tree on the river bank and runs from thence N 9 W to the beach line to a stake thence N 81 E $16\frac{2}{3}$ poles to a stake thence S 9 E to 2 beaches on the river bank thence down the river to the beginning Containing 19 acres and 79 poles.

N. 4 Begins at 2 beaches on the river bank and runs N 9 W to a stake in the back line thence N 81 E $12\frac{2}{3}$ poles to a stake thence S 9 E to a sugar tree and elm on the river bank thence down the river to the beginning Containing $11\frac{3}{4}$ acres

N. 5 Begins at a sugar tree and elm on the river bank and runs N 9 W to a stake in the back line thence N 81 E $12\frac{2}{3}$ poles to a stake thence S 9 E to a beach on the river bank thence down the river to the beginning Containing $15\frac{1}{2}$ acres

N. 6 Begins on the river bank on a beach and runs N 9 W to a stake in the back line thence N 81 E $12\frac{2}{3}$ poles to a stake thence S 9 E to a beach on the river bank thence down the river to the beginning $15\frac{1}{2}$ acres and 18 poles.



N. 8 begins on a beach on the river bank and runs N 9 W to a stake in the original survey thence S 9 E 220 poles with one of the old lines to the upper corner on the river

three down the river to the beginning containing 14 acres and
 109 $\frac{1}{2}$ poles. And of the remainder of the slaves the valuation
 of which amounts to \$1100 we cannot divide in kind equal
 between said heirs and of the residue of the personal property
 which amounts to \$175.30 we assign to each heir the sum
 of \$21¹/₂ 9¹/₂. all the heirs of said Peter Stephens who were over the
 age of 21 years being personally present and consenting to the
 division without being notified and the guardians of James
 right and Allen were present and Capt. Jeremiah Black who
 was appointed the Guardian for William and Nancy Stephens in part
 under 21 & over 14 being by their choice also approving the
 foregoing division having fully inspected the same.
