of Cumberland and a State of Kentucky as heretofore  
make my last will and testament in manner and  
form following that is to say

- 1<sup>st</sup> I desire that so much of my perishable property  
Immediately sold as will be sufficient to pay my last  
debts and funeral expenses
- 2<sup>d</sup> after the payment of my just debts and funeral  
expenses. I leave to my wife Jane Shugart all my  
property of every description to her use and benefit until  
my youngest Child is married or becomes of lawful  
age and after the youngest Child becomes of lawful  
age or is married. I desire that my wife Jane Shugart  
shall have my negro boy Frank and my negro woman  
Ray and all acts of my property of every description and  
after the death of my wife my desire is that that all my  
property of every description be sold and equally divided  
amongst my lawful Children. But in making a division  
of my estate Care must be taken so as to make each one  
of the Children account for all they have received  
from me in my life time - or may hereafter out of my  
estate. here follows the amount of property that is to be  
deducted out of each Childs part so far as they have received  
at this time received from me out of my estate Obadiah  
Claywell wife of John Claywell has received \$100 -  
William H Shugart has received \$85 - Elvira Potts <sup>Shugart</sup> ~~Claywell~~  
has received \$63 - Catherine Smiths wife of L Smith has re-  
ceived \$63 - Zachariah Shugart has received \$58 - Sally Norris  
has received \$48. all the above amounts is to be deducted  
out of their respective parts of my estate when ever the  
division shall take place

and secondly - I do hereby constitute and appoint  
my wife Jane Shugart & William H Shugart executors  
of my last will and testament hereby revoking all others  
or former wills or testaments heretofore made by me  
to which whereof I have hereunto set my hand and  
affixed my seal this 5<sup>th</sup> Day of August 1855
