The some Gold I bequeath to my daughter Nancy Yates my dearest maid I bequeath to my wife Sally Young and it is my desire that my daughter Polly Young have the first Gold that lands Raised from the said manor all my other property whatever I bequeath to my beloved wife Sally Young to be at her disposal during her life and at her death and as for my daughter Polly from and Susanna Chaney having Provided for them to the best of my ability when they were maids have not made any Provision for them at present and appoint Archer Young and Samuel Young my Executors to this my last will to which I have signed my name this 28th day of April 1827
