Memorandum, That on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of May in the year 1828 - John C. King of the County of Cumberland and State of Kentucky - Being sick of the sickness whereof he died on the same day at his dwelling house in said County, did make and declare his last will and testament nuncupative in these or words of the like substance that is to say

1<sup>st</sup> Informing us that his wish was that it should be clearly understood by us that he was of sound and serene mind and also in his proper senses  
2<sup>nd</sup> He wishes all written wills heretofore made by him revoked, particularly spoke of and revoked a written Will then in his power and dated July 1826 Enclosed on the envelope that the within is not my will, signed John C. King Encourament bears date 12<sup>th</sup> February 1828

3<sup>rd</sup> He wished William Blankenship Or William King the supposed son of William King Deceased of whom Milton King is appointed guardian, To have a share worth only hundred dollars and also Forty Dollars in Commonwealth Bank paper  
4<sup>th</sup> His wish was that all advancements heretofore made to his legal heirs to be thrown back into stock pot, and equally divided amongst his legal heirs and also all of his estate, both Real & Personal, of which he died legally entitled to to be equally divided amongst his legal heirs May 15<sup>th</sup> 1828
