Be the name of God Amen I Oliver Wesley of the County of Cumberland and State of Kentucky being frail and much afflicted in body but of sound mind and memory and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die and after that the judgment do wither bonitate and apperent this my last will and testament first of all I recommend my soul to almighty God and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent & chaste & decent manner at the discretion of my friends, making nothing but I shall receive it againe at the general resurrection, and as touching all worldly estate where with it has pleased God to bless me I give and bequeath the same in the following manner to wit: I will that my last debts be paid and I prefer first and in preference to my beloved wife Elizabeth the use and benefit of the tract of land whereon I now reside, to wit: a tract of one hundred acres until the youngest child I have had by her that yet be then living comes of age, the use of which land is to assist her in raising and educating the children in a reasonable manner according to the opportunity she may have and after said youngest child comes of age my said wife's right of Dower in said tract of land to remaine to her during her natural life and when my said wife use of said land & tenements my children that I have had by her to have an equal interest in it and as to my goods and moveable estate of all descriptions whatsoever I give and bequeath them to my beloved wife, during her widowhood for the use and benefit of her and my children. Mary, Priscilla John Samuel Rebeck, B. Zephaniah & Anna, and should my said wife hereafter decease I will that she have her right of Dower in the same and I do hereby bequeath and appoint my beloved brother Zephania Wesley son & heir of this my last will and testament & testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 17th day of January 1826, signed & acknowledged in presence of
