The undersigned Commissioners appointed by the com-  
 missioners the County Court of the County aforesaid at their last  
 term to divide & value the lands of George Reynolds de-  
 ceased having met on the 20<sup>th</sup> acre tract which was oc-  
 cupied by the said Reynolds in his life time on the day and  
 date above said and being sworn according to law by Thomas  
 Jurgus a Justice of the peace for the County aforesaid, and the said
