

George Richardson

In the name of God Amen, I George Richardson of the County of Cumberland and State of Kentucky, being low in health, though of sound mind and memory, do make and declare this my last will and testament. My Bequeath 1st I do bequeath and give unto my beloved wife Cyrene Richardson, amere, known by the name of flag, bridle and saddle, a Cow & Calf and her trunk and clothing other bed and furniture, these to be her own property, for to dispose of, as she pleases, either in her life time, or at her death.

Bequeath 2^d I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Louisa Richardson, a horse, bridle & saddle and a Cow & Calf, and the balance of the house hold and kitchen furniture (two beds excepted) to be for the use of my aforesaid wife & grand daughter, and so much stock as will be necessary for them to keep, these to be theirs both jointly until they separate, then to be divided equally between them both.

Bequeath 3^d I do give and bequeath unto my two daughters Rachael Johnston & Peggy, each of them, a bed & furniture which was before received.

Bequeath 4th It is my wish, that the balance of the stock, which is not necessary for my wife and grand daughter to keep, should be sold, the money go to them for their support.

Bequeath 5th It is my wish that the three hundred acres of land, which I hold on Kink's Creek be sold and the money be divided equally among the heirs and the one hundred and fifty acres which I now live on of which the plantation is a part my wish is to be for the support of said plantation and for my Beloved wife Cyrene Richardson to have the aforesaid plantation and dwelling, have her life time and after her death my desire is that the aforesaid one hundred and fifty acres including the plantation and buildings, shall be sold, and the money divided between the heirs. Executors William Kern & Morgan Richardson.

Bequeath 6th I give & bequeath unto my son George, eighty acres of land, which is adjoining this plantation.
