Second It is my desire that my beloved wife Sarah Scott shall have and hold for her use and benefit and Comfort (for herself) during her natural life, all of my Estate, both real, and personal Consisting of Lands, horses and Cattle, sheep, hogs, plantation tools, House &

Kentucky Cumberland County Oct.

In Obedience to the directions of the Order of the Cumberland County Court made at their June Term 1840 appointing us Commissioners to lay off & assigne dower to Mrs Elizabeth Tamm wife of John Tamm in the Slaves belonging to Peter S. Seaboard deceased late the husband of said Elizabeth. On this day proceeded to discharge the duties assigned us and make the following report.

Mr Value. negro girl, Martha, aged 22 years	\$575.00
Mr Value. negro girl, Vicer, aged 15 years	450.00
Mr Value negro girl, Felina aged 7 years	925.00
Mr Value. negro boy, Winkin, aged 13 months	130.00

The one third of this sum is the dower interest of Mrs. Tamm, and we assign & allot to her the negro Girl Martha. The dower interest amounting to the sum of \$466.66 2/3 Cents and Martha. Value exceeding that amount the sum of \$103.33 1/3 Cents upon which sum Mrs. Tamm is to pay in trust, during her life, to the female infant child of said Peter S. Seaboard deceased. The other negroes before named are allotted & assigned to said Infant.
