

In the name of God, Amen I Henry Farmer of the County of Cumberland and state of Kentucky being low in health but in my perfect senses mind and memory, and knowing that it is appointed one for all men to die I do make and ordain this my last will and Testament - that is I recommend my soul to God who gave it, and I desire my body may be buried in a Christian like manner and as touching such worldly estate as it has pleased God to bestow on me I give and bequeath in the manner & form following (that is to say - I give unto my loving wife Mary Farmer one Bay mare, one black cow & house hold furniture) and one hundred Dollars in money that is due to me when it is collected and what money there is now by me also I give and bequeath to my daughter Susanna - forty five one dollar more than what I have already give her - also ten I give and bequeath to my daughter Peggy Cupperhaver one dollar more than what I have already give her - also ten I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Steady one dollar more than what I have already give her - also ten I give and bequeath to my daughter Catty Luvash one dollar more than what I have already give her - also ten I give and bequeath to my son John Farmer one dollar more than what I have already give him - also ten I give and bequeath to my son Henry Farmer one hundred and sixty seven acres of land lying in Tennessee in Knox County on Hook Creek - and one hundred and seventy five Dollars in money that is due me - and the waggon and horse and the gear - also ten I give and bequeath to my daughter Polly Farmer one dollar more than what I have already give her - also ten I give and bequeath to my son Jacob Farmer one dollar more than what I have already give him - also ten I give and bequeath to my son George Farmer one dollar more than what I have already give him - also ten I give and bequeath to my daughter Sally Luvash one dollar more than what I have already give her - Reserving all other instruments of writings heretofore made by me as touching the same - In witness I have hereunto set my hand and seal this tenth day of January 1820
