I Wesleyiah Ellington of the County of Cumberland & State of Kentucky do here by make my last will & testament in manner and form following - That is to say.

1st I give unto Samuel D. Ellington, Patsy W. Philpott, Polly M. Philpott, Eliza B. Parkinson and Neddy Ann Brummall three Children, All of the property and money which they have received up to this time including negroes which they have in possession

2^d I give unto my David A. H. Ellington the tract of land where I now live containing 322 Acres be the same more or less one negro man named Burrell, one negro woman named Dookey one horse called Bluster, two cows & calves, one cart & harness, one bed & furniture, all my plantation utensils, of every description one still, and also one half of my present crop now growing, consisting of tobacco, corn, wheat, rice, cotton, oats and every other commodity which is now growing or has been raised in the present year 1840. To him and his heirs forever -

3^d I give unto my son Samuel D. Ellington one negro boy named Jim, and also give him three hundred dollars in money.

4th I give unto my Grand Daughter Obedience Brummall one negro girl named Caroline.

I th give unto my children David A. H. Ellington, Samuel S. Ellington, Eliza W. Perkinson, Patsy W. Philpott, Dolly M. Philpott and Widley Brummall three children. All the remainder of my Estate both real & personal, which property I wish my Executors here after named to make sale of to the highest bidder on nine months credit. And after sold to be equally divided amongst them. - I wish David A. H. Ellington, Samuel S. Ellington, Eliza W. Perkinson, Patsy W. Philpott, Dolly M. Philpott and Widley Brummall now dees

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint David A. H. Ellington and Barton Philpott Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all others a former Wills or Testaments by me heretofore made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 14th day of August 1840.
