County and State of Kentucky, who being in perfect mind &
memory, do hereby revoke, annul & set aside all former
wills by me heretofore made, and do hereby make & declare
this to be my only valid & last will & Testament, which is
in manner & form as follows namely:

Firstly, It is my will & desire, that my body shall
be buried in a decent & plain manner, without ostentation
or unnecessary parade.

Secondly, It is my will & desire, that my funeral expenses
and all my just debts be punctually paid.

Thirdly, It is my will & desire, that my beloved wife
Polly Taylor, shall have all the balance of my estate, real,
personal & mixed. And I do hereby give & bequeath
the whole of it to her, with the exception of my two negro
men Slaves Shadrack & Joe, who I will and bequeath unto

297 her my beloved wife Polly, for the space of four years from & after my death, and after the expiration of the four years aforesaid it is my will & desire that the said Shadrack & Soc, shall be set free and emancipated - provided they shall be obedient to and faithfully and industriously serve my beloved wife Polly for and during the aforesaid four years - and finally and lastly, I do hereby nominate & appoint my beloved wife Polly Taylor executrix of this my last will & testament.
