That my daughters Mary Rachel Sarah & Margaret each to have and have a Chaise with floor or less each and one cow each and Sarah and Margaret each a saddle and block each of the above named girls are to have their bed and bed clothes that is here and my son Thomas to have one bed & furniture and one cow and after my funeral charges is paid the remainder to be equally divided amongst my heirs
