after being divided in manner aforesaid, the heirs proceeded to make choice, and the first lot was drawn by Michael L. Stoner one of the heirs of said decedent and the second by John M. Emerton Junior, the other heir of said Francis Emerton deceased, and from the valuation annexed by us to said slaves, we divided them in as equal a manner as they would admit of, and consider the lot drawn by said Stoner worth \$25 more than the one drawn by said John M.
