Madison Baker to them and their heirs forever the following named slaves, to wit; Fanny, Charles, Milton, Wm. Milley & Lindy, and I give and bequeath to my Brother Daniel Baker, Molly and Jacob and in case that Fanny has no other Child or Children I give and bequeath Lindy to my five brothers before mentioned but in case she has a Child or Children I give and bequeath to my sister Majora & I give and bequeath to my sister Susanah & Francis Baker and dollar to her and her heirs forever Lindy and her increase. I do hereby nominate, and do appoint my Father James Baker Executor of his my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my hand and seal this 17<sup>th</sup> day of November 1829, acknowledged & subscribed in the presence of us
