I John Laswell of Cumberland County & State of Kentucky do hereby make my last will and Testament in manner & form following that is to say.

- First I desire that so much of the perishable part of my Estate be sold after my decease, and out of the money arising there from all my just debts to be paid & also funeral & expenses - Paid
- Second. After the payment of my just debts & funeral Expenses are paid, I give to my Wife Mary Laswell all of my Estate both real and personal during her natural life her Widowhood, and after her decease, I give the same to my Children herein after named.
- Third. I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Welch one Bred Cow which she has received.
- Fourth. I give to my Daughter Alley Davis one Cow and Calf which she has received.
- Fifth. I give to my Daughter Nancy Propper one Bay mare which she has received.
- Sixth. I give to my son William Laswell one Bay horse which he has received.
- Seventh. I give to my son Andrew Laswell one Bay horse which he has rec^d.
- Eighth. I give to my son Moses Laswell one gray horse which he has received.

Ninth. I give to my Daughter Dicy Taylor one Servil
 man which she has received.
 Tenth. I give to my Daughter Campbell thirty Dollars to
 be paid to her out of the money arising from the
 Sale of my property.
 Eleventh. I give to my Daughter Susanor Laswell \$20.
 to be paid to her out of the money arising from
 the sale of my property.
 Twelfth. I give to my Daughter Polly Dickson one
 Servil man which she has received.
 Thirteenth. I give to my son John Laswell. At the decease
 of my wife my negro man Patrick and all the
 Balance of my Estate. Real Estate and personal
 not heretofore Willed away.
 Lastly. I do constitute and appoint my wife Dicy
 Laswell my executrix, to this last Will and
 Testament, her by executing all of these or some
 Will or Testaments by me here to be made.
