King deceased, and by the request and agreement of five of the heirs at law of said John C. King deceased, which agreement is marked A. and here shewn to the Court, we proceeded on the 2^d 3^d 4th days of October 1828 to survey and divide the lands aforesaid, which division is as follows, to wit, We have divided the aforesaid lands, that is, the tract of land on which John C. King resided at his death, and the tracts adjoining thereto altogether containing 702 acres and 25 poles into three parts or surveys, and each survey or plot is numbered 1 2 & 3. 


