Semple deceased, in lands, slaves and personal estate of which said Semple died, seized and possessed of, and divided the remainder of the said estate among the several heirs or distributees of said John W. Semple in the following manner to wit, to wit Nos 64-65-66-67-68 and 69 in the town of Seventy six including the mill and Cotton Machine and the houses and out houses on which the said Lucy Semple widow as aforesaid, now lives and occupies, are assigned to her, for her dower in the lands, and a negro man named Tom - a negro woman named Sassy and a negro girl named Charis, for her dower in the slaves, and the sum of two hundred and fifty six dollars 14 Cents, for her dower in the personal estate -

To James Semple one of the heirs as aforesaid, lots Nos 101. 102. 103. 104. 105. 106. 107. 108. 109. 110. 111. 112. 113. 114. 115. 116. 85 & 88 including a Store house, Stable &c and an undivided ninth part of lot No. 105 the big falls of Indian Creek) and also an undivided ninth part of a tract of land, containing by survey 25 acres, adjoining the big falls, and conveyed by deed from J. M. Williams to J. W. Semple's representatives, for his part of the land, by paying \$55 Cents specie to the estate; and a negro man named Jerry for his part of the slaves, by paying \$915-57 Cents specie to the estate - and the sum of \$67-18 Cents currency for his part of the personal estate -

To William A. Cheatham who married Elizabeth Semple is assigned one hundred acres of land, on the head waters of Stephen Creek in Cumberland County, being one moiety of two hundred acres, granted to John W. Semple by patent dated the 9th day of July 1817 and an undivided ninth part of the big falls and 25 acres of land aforesaid, for his part of the land, by paying to the estate the sum of \$26-57 Cents - specie - and a negro man named Henry, for his part of the slaves, by paying to the estate the sum of \$80-57. specie and the sum of \$99-02 Currency for his part of the personal estate -

To Curtis Garner who married Frances Semple is assigned 38 acres of land, adjoining the town of Seventy six bounded as follows to wit, Beginning at the eastern corner of the said town, thence S. 46° N. along the town line 43 poles to a stake, thence S. 82° E. 38 1/2 poles to a stake on E. R. Semple's line, thence along said line N. 40° E. 75 poles to a stake, thence N. 55° W. 89 1/2 poles to a stake, thence S. 40° W. 26 poles to the town line, thence along the town line S. 44° E.
