price of land, which land is to be valued after my (Deceased) it
further my will and desire that this above tract of land should
should be valued equal to cash, and the said William Cain
is bound to pay each legatee that is to say (Rebecca Cain &
Athen above named) which is to have the price of said fifty acres of

land in trade at the same rates the land is valued at them I
 give & bequeath to my son Thomas Stanfield one dollar to him
 and his heirs, & further my will I desire that the rest &
 residue of my Estate both real & personal after paying
 paying my funeral Expenses & and lawful debts, should
