 as followeth. To wit, I do hereby vest and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth
 my whole Estate which I now have both personal and real to my youngest
 child Jane comes to the age of twenty one years at which time I vest, give and
 bequeath to my two sons William & Alfred Strong all my lands and Tenements
 by these giving them mother Elizabeth Strong land with sufficient security for a
 Hanson maintained for her during her life time and by paying three
 Strong my daughter one fifth part of the value of my whole Estate both
 personal and real after settling my children and maintaining them, and
 the balance if any should remain, to be equally divided among my three
 children above named and its further my request that if my children should
 prove disobedient to their mother that they should be brought to some good
 man to learn some good & profitable trade and I do also appoint & re-
 quest Dennis Hopkins & Pleasant H. Micham together with wife as Executors of
