 Cumberland & State of Kentucky calling to mind the frailty
 uncertainty & the necessity of making a distribution of the worldly
 effects which I claim the right to and being in my perfect
 mind & of sound & disposing memory do make ordain constitute
 & declare the following to be my last will & Testament, hereby
 nullifying & revoking all wills by me heretofore made first I
 give my hand son John W. Baker son of Thomas Baker
 one half of my land which I hold under a deed of
 partition between James Baker William Baker & my self
 to be divided according to quantity & quality so as he shall

 have the mansion house where I live & the improved land around
 the same with all the buildings & ornaments there to appertain the
 improvements not to be consid^d in the valuation of the land
 also one half of my part of the mill on Keyser brook it is expressly
 understood that Susannah Baker wife of Thomas Baker dec^d
 is not to be interrupted during her natural life nor the Estate
 of Thomas Baker to be answerable for any part of the
 debts made previous to his death all of which I give to him & his
 heirs for ever — Second I give unto my son Wm Baker on half
 of my part of the mill on Keyser brook to him & his heirs forever
 Third I give unto my Grand Son Ephraim Baker son of my son
 Wm Baker dec^d one half of my land not given nor debted
 away to him & his heirs for ever — Fourth I give unto Frances E. Baker
 fifty dollars to be paid out of my estate to her & her heirs forever
 Fifth I give unto my daughter in Law Susan Baker one Negro man
 named Saml to her & her heirs for ever — Sixth I give unto Phil
 Chalkley fifty dollars for services rendered in my family
 And finally it is my will that all my last debts should be
 paid so soon as convenient after my decease & after the payments
 of my debts as afo^r the distribution & payment of the different
 bequests herein made to the legatees if there should be any residue
 of my estate such residue shall be equally divided between my
 daughters Sally A. Sherman Frances E. Baker Mary C. Baker
 Cynthia W. Wichey & Elizabeth W. Maudison formerly Flowers
 Lastly I appoint my executor James Baker the executor
