I John Creasey of Cumberland County and State of Kentucky do hereby make my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to say

- First. I desire that my just debts be paid by my Executors hereafter mentioned
- Second. I give and bequeath to my wife Sally Creasey all my estate both real and personal during her natural life
- Third. I give to my son Joseph Creasey one hundred acres of land out of the original Survey, agreeable to a division line already run by Thomas Barton agreeable to the course and distance, as laid down in his plat, and also one half of a fifty acre Survey, adjoining the same, to be divided agreeable to quality & quantity.
- Fourth. I also give to my son William Creasey 134 acres of land out of the original Survey as above and 1/2 of the 50 acre Survey as above mentioned.
- Fifth. I give to my son John Creasey 1/2 One hundred & 34 acres of land

Out of the Original Survey also 166 Acre of Land Out of the same Survey above mentioned it being the intent that my son Thomas Creasy had to hold land and purchase from him by the said John Creasy Jr.

also 72 Acre of a late Survey adjoining the lands of Thomas Murrell provided the same is not sold before my decease.

6<sup>th</sup> And at my decease and that of my wife. The balance of my Estate of every description not heretofore mentioned, to be equally divided between my several Daughters. That is to say, My Daughters Martha Creasy Sally Agins, Lucy Lewis, Nancy Smith, & Susanna Creasy.
