In the name of God, Amen, I Joseph Skin of the County of Cumberland State of Kentucky, being weak and sickly in body, but of a sound mind and memory, and knowing that there is no law appointed for all men to die, do make and ordain this my last will & testament in manner and form following -

I give unto my four first children by my first wife & to wit, William Skin, Anne Rufel, Joseph Skin & James Skin, Pat, a negro woman and her increase to them, and also five shillings apiece to them and their heirs forever, -

I give unto my beloved wife Saurany Skin, (and furniture bed and furniture to be at her own disposal, (also I give unto my said wife all the residue and remaining part of my estate both real and personal, during her natural life or widowhood and provide she should marry again, then to have a lawful part during her lifetime, and then to revolve to my two last children which I had by her, viz, Josiah Skin & Tabitha Skin - I give and bequeath unto my son Josiah Skin one half of my land (viz) that part which is now in farm, also my negro man & horses, at the death of my wife, also a horse worth twenty Dollars to remain on the place as a plantation horse during the life or widowhood of his mother; & also to my daughter Tabitha Skin the other half of my land and all monies due to me now, provided however that her mother is to have the use of the money during her life or widowhood, and the residue of my estate to be equally divided between my two said children, Josiah & Tabitha - And lastly I nominate and appoint my wife Saurany Skin and Obadiah Baker sole Executors to this my last will and testament - revoking all former wills heretofore made by me. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and this twentieth day of November One thousand eight hundred and ^{thirty} two -
