Joseph Jewells Will.

In the name of God Amen. I Joseph Jewell of the County of Cumberland and State of Kentucky, being of sound mind & memory, but old, frail & weak in body, do make and publish this as my last will & testament, revoking, annulling and setting aside, all other wills by me heretofore made.

First. It is my will and desire that my daughter Catharine Lewis, have the land upon which Richard Lewis now lives, containing fifty acres by survey, during her natural life, and at her death, I give said fifty acres of land to my two grand daughters Colina & Serena Lewis forever. I also give to my two said grand daughters, fifty Dollars each, to be paid to them by my Executors hereafter named, at my death.

Secondly. I give to my grand daughter Sally Black, the fifty acres of land, upon which she now lives, during her natural life, and at her death, I give said land to all her children theirs forever.

Thirdly. I give and bequeath to my two grand daughters Louisa Keeton and Sally Lee, the tract of land, upon which they now live, containing One hundred and twenty two acres and a half acres, by survey, during their natural lives, to be equally divided between them, and at their death, I give the same to their children forever.

Fourthly. I give and bequeath to my two grand daughters Susannah Lockett and Sally Ferguson the tract of land which I own, lying on the ridge between the waters of Brush Creek and Wheelstone, containing One hundred acres, to have forever.

Fifthly. It is my will and desire, that all the balance of my estate, which I now own or may own at any death, real, personal or mixed, be given to my daughter Catharine Lewis forever.

Sixthly. I hereby constitute & appoint Joel Overley and Mr. Cheek Executors of this my last will and testament.
