I Joseph Simpson of the County of Cumberland and State of Kentucky, being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory, blessed be Almighty God for the same do make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner and form following (that is to say) first I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Anne my real Est. - I also give and demise unto my son Samuel Simpson all my land upon the side of Harrods fork on which he now live with all the appurtenances thereto belonging being part of the tract on which I live. I also give and demise unto my Grand son Josiah Hunter all my mess uage or house and land, on the side of said fork upon which I now live, being part of the tract of ^{land} with all the appurtenances thereto belonging, provided, my said wife is to have the use of dwelling home for her life & so much of the profits accruing, from the rents of said land, and house given and demise to said Josiah Hunter as is necessary for her support -

I also give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Nancy Simpson daughter of Thom Simpson Sr. one Cow, head and head clothes, when she becomes of age - I also give and bequeath unto my Grand son Joseph Simpson, son of John Simpson, one Cow - I also give and bequeath, unto my daughter Elizabeth Elliott, one hose to worth forty dollars in Trade rated in Common at the bank notes. I also give and order that my daughter Ann Hunter have one acre of land, of the part given to Josiah Hunter and that he build her a comfortable house thereon, and furnish her with five barrels of Corn a year for her life. Should she require the same - I also give and bequeath unto Margaret Simpson daughter of Samuel Simpson, one Cow. I also give and bequeath unto my son James Simpson one Cow. - And lastly as to all the rest residue and remaind of my personal Estate goods and Chattels of what kind and nature soever, I give and order that the same should be appraised at my death, and that my said son Samuel Simpson and my said Grand son Josiah Hunter, whom I hereby appoint sole executors of this my last will and Testament, have the use of the same until

two years after the death of my said wife. And that the amount of such appraisement, be then equally divided amongst my Children, hereafter named, *Wm*, George Simpson, John Simpson and Charles Simpson. Hereby revoking all former wills, by me made, or witnessed whereby I, and hereunto set my hand and seal this 28th day of March 1830 -
