Pursuant to an order of the Cumberland County Court,
 made at the November term 1835 appointing the undersigned Com-
 missioners to assign & lay off to Lucey Vining, late Lucey Wash-
 ington widow & heir of Thomas Wash deceased, her dower in the lands
 and slaves of her deceased husband, we proceeded on the 17th of
 December 1835 being first duly qualified according to law, to lay
 off and assign her dower in the slaves do wit.

Given a negro man at \$650.00
 Given a negro woman at 300.00

The amount which the above sums want
 of making the dower equal to 43rd of the
 whole of the negroes

87.50 \$1037.50

And being unable to proceed on account of the absence of necessary
 papers, we adjourned and met again on this day, the 5th of
 April 1836 and proceeded to conclude the business, by assigning
 the following boundary as her dower in the home tract do wit
 Beginning at a black ash and two oaks and together on
 the bank of Cumberland River and corner to original survey, thence
 up the line reversing the same North 112 poles to a stake in the line
 thence North 57th 112 poles to a stake in the field near the Mannins
 house, thence S 30th 14 poles to the barn, leaving that building within

261 the dovers, thence South 88 poles to the river, thence up the river to the Beginning
 We further assign to the widows Ann undivided third part of a woodland
 tract of 100 acres, that lies opposite to the home tract on the other side of the
 river, and then having no further business before us, we adjourned. 20th Apr. 1836.
