In the name of god Amen the 5<sup>th</sup> day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & nineteen I Michael Johnston of Cumberland County Kentucky being in a low state of health but in perfect memory thanks be to god for the same & calling to mind the mortality of men and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die. Do make and ordain this my last will & Testament that is to say principally and first of all - I give & recommend my soul in the hands of God that gave it and for my body I recommend it to the earth to be buried in a Christian manner at the direction of my Executors and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased god to bless me within this life I give divide and dispose of the same in manner & form following that is to say in the first place I give and bequeath to my dearly beloved wife Elisabeth Johnston the plantation whereon I do live containing 10 1/2 acres of land and if my wife shall think proper to have the said land sold for my Executors to make a note to the purchaser and my wife to have the money to purchase more land and if she should not purchase land at her death for the money received for the land to be divided betwixt my two sons Michael Johnston & Richard Johnston; and if the land is not sold for it at my wife's death to be divided equally betwixt the above named Michael & Richard Johnston also by my desire that my wife have all my stock house hold & kitchen furniture, to have & to hold so long as my wife Elisabeth Johnston should live; and it is my desire that my wife may see so much of the stock as she may think proper as to raise one hundred & thirty Dollars, and

for my wife to let my son Alexander Schuster had the 130  
 Dollars for his use and at my wife death for all took home  
 hold & kitchen furniture to hold and equally divided between  
 Alexander Schuster my son and my daughter Elisabeth Schuster,  
 & Michael Schuster & Miriam Schuster, I gave and bequeath to  
 my daughter Nancy Charis and cow & calf & feather Bed which  
 she has received, I gave & bequeath to my daughter Margaret  
 Combs and cow & calf and feather Bed which she has re-  
 ceived, I gave & bequeath to my daughter Katharine Charis  
 and cow & calf, & feather Bed which she has received, I had at  
 note on James Carter for 100 Dollars which if received I wish to be  
 equally divided between my wife, Alexander Schuster, Michael Schu-  
 ster & Miriam Schuster. It my desire that Alexander Schuster &  
 my wife Elisabeth Schuster be my Executors of this my  
 last Will & Testament, and I do hereby, utterly, disallow, revoke  
 & disannul all and every other former Testament Will & Legate  
 bequeath & Executor by me in any way before this time, named  
 & bequeathed, ratifying & confirming this, & no other to  
 be my last Will & Testament - In Witness whereof, I have
