I Moses Smith son of Cumberland County and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and disposing memory do make this my last will and Testament in manner and form following (Wit) First it is my wish that all my Just debts be paid out of the possible part of my property 2nd I give to my son Daniel V. Smith the tract of land which he now lives lying in Cumberland County on the head waters of Cassey fork, containing by estimation one hundred and sixteen acres be the same more or less it being the tract of land purchased by me from ^{Adam} J. Merington & I give to my two sons Thomas Smith and Daniel V. Smith my tract of land lying in Adair County on which I formerly lived containing by estimation two hundred acres be the same more or less and they the said Thomas and Daniel V. Smith to pay to my grand Daughter Lucinda Stinson one fourth of the value of the said 200 acres of land when sold or divided between them all the balance of property of every description whatsoever not given in this will

I Give to my two sons Thomas Smith Daniel V. Smith and Silley Bennett to be equally divided between them having had to fore given to my other Children not named in this will what I intended for them I do here by Appoint my two sons Thomas Smith and Daniel V. Smith Executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other and forebear
