Mathan Thurman of the state and County aforesaid being of sound mind and disposing memory do make and declare this instrument of writing as and for my last will and testament, in manner and form following

- 1st I give and bequeath and hereby ratify and confirm all of my previous gifts to any of my children, of both Slaves & their property.
- 2nd I give to Harriet Smith my grand daughter a negro boy Daniel - my grand daughter Betsy Smith a negro boy Jim - I give to Susan Smith my grand daughter a negro girl Mary and her increase - I give to Charles my grand son a negro boy Peter
- 3rd I give daughter Aley Smith land her four children namely; Susan, Harriet, Francis and Betsy five slaves & their increase namely Estlin, Judy, Sarah, Shadrach, & Martin to Aley her life time & at her death to be equally divided between the aforesaid four children But the slaves & their increase in the 2nd devise are to remain all together and labour for the mutual support & maintenance of Aley and her said four children, and the Slaves given in the 2nd devise are not to be given into the possession of the respective children, till they severally arrive to the full age of twenty one years, Butt Aley the mother may loan the Slaves to the children, or either of them, before they arrive to the age of twenty one years -
- 4th I lend to my daughter Lucy Woodrudge, wife of Daniel Woodridge a negro boy named John and a negro girl named Ggy & their increase and my tract of land in Todd's County, whereon the said Daniel now lives, for the support and maintenance of said Lucy and her children during her natural life, and at the death of said Lucy, the Slaves & increase & land to be sold by my Executor and the money arising from the Sales to be equally divided between the said Lucy then living children -
- 5th I give to my grand daughter Amanda Woodridge a negro girl named Catha and her increase.
- 6th I give to Lucy Thurman daughter of my son William two negroes named Sylvia & Nelly & their increase -
- 7th I give to Winifred Alexander daughter of my son in law Alexander a negro girl named Genny & their increase -
- 8th I give to Elizabeth Gray Alexander daughter of my son in law W. Alexander a negro named Charlotte & their increase -
- 9th I give to Martha S. Alexander daughter of my son in law Mrs. M. Alexander for a negro girl named Mariah and her increase -
- 10th I lend to my daughter Susan Murphy wife of H. Murphy the tract of land, whereon she now lives, during her natural life, or her and her husbands living together in peace and harmony and without fighting and in either event, the said tract of land to be sold by executor, and the money arising from or by the Sale, to be applied by my executor to the support and maintenance of said Susan, during her natural life, and at her death, the money if any, remaining in the hands of my Executor to be legally divided among her then living children -
- 11th I give and bequeath to my son Little B. Thurman the lower part of the one undivided half of the tract of land, on which Snow lives, to be run and divided, agreeably to an article of agreement entered into between my son Little B. & my son in law, W. H. Alexander & now of record in the Clerk's office of the Cumberland County Court in ...
- 12th All bonds, notes, accounts and all my personal estates of whatsoever kind at my death and also all money, which I may

32 have at my death to be equally divided among all my then living children but all my debts are first to be paid & discharged
 15th I hereby revoke & declare null & void, all former wills be made and devises therein contained, and declare this as my last & last will and testament

I hereby nominate as executors to this my last will & testament, Little Buffurman, John M. Alexander Jr and Willie H. Alexander to, carry into effect all an every provision of this instrument of writing. — Given under my hand and seal, at my residence this 31st day of March in the year of our Lord 1828
