Land at his death I give Lorenzo B. Bow I give and bequeath
unto my son John Bow her and furniture and one Cow
and Calf I give and bequeath unto my son Lorenzo B. Bow
her and furniture and Cow and Calf I give and bequeath
unto my daughter Malinda Bow her and furniture
One Cow and Calf I give and bequeath unto my son Japoy
Bow the tract of land whereon I now live fifty acres
more or less I wish to settle him that he may have the care
of his mother and her children and her grand children
that will live with him I also leave him to manage for
my son John as he is not capable of managing for
himself I wish my negroes bound out to pay debts
until same expected property comes in from my Brother
John estate in the State of Virginia then I wish an
equal division between my wife and children giving her
her equal share first the property to be divided Salina
lotted and I hereby appoint my beloved wife Rachel Bow
Executive and my son Jesse Bow Executors of this my last
will and Testament Revoking all former wills by me made

 have been contracted since and managed together
 into all my stocks of Cash and every description
 and farming utensils with all my house hold

 wares which property above specified I Give to
 my aforesaid wife her heirs forever
