The Nuncupative Will of John Page spoken in his last illness and at his own house when he died on the 28th day of May 1819 in Cumberland County being in his proper mind, he the decedent stated that as to his worldly affairs his will was that what money he had he left to his wife dores to be at her own disposal, also that what property, goods, chattle, rights and credits he died possessed of, should be at the disposal of his said wife dores for and during her widowhood, and that upon the decease of the said dores the whole was to be equally divided amongst his children. This Will was spoken in presence of Lucy Kirkpatrick, Catharine Biggers, John B. Page, & Samuel W. Page -
