In the name of god Amen I Oliver Woolley of the County of Cumberland and State of Kentucky being frail and afflicted in body but of unimpaired mind and memory and knowing that it is appointed for all men, next to die and after that the Judgment do with the best advice and consent of his next of kin and testament first I have committed my soul to almighty god that gave it and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian like manner at the Direction of my friends, making nothing but I shall revive it againe at the general Resurrection, and as touching all worldly estate where with it has pleased god to bless me I give and bequeath the same in the following manner to wit: I will that my just debts be paid and I prefer five and no more, with to my beloved wife Elizabeth the use and benefit of the tract of land whereon I now reside, Estimated at one hundred acres until the youngest child I have had by her that yet be then living beyond the age, the use of which land is to assist her in raising and educating the children in a reasonable manner according to the opportunity she may have and after said youngest child beyond the age, my said wife's right of Dower in said tract of land to remaine to her during her natural life and when my said wife use of said land & tenements my children that I have had by her to have an Equal interest in it and as to my goods and movable estate of all descriptions whatsoever I give and bequeath them to my beloved wife, during her widowhood for the use and benefit of her and my children, Mary, Priscilla John Samuel Rachel, B Zeaphenial & Anna, and should my said wife hereof any way disapprove I will that she have her right of Dower in the same and I do hereby bequeath and appoint my beloved brother Zeaphenia Woolley sole Executor of this my last will and testament In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 17<sup>th</sup> day of January 1826, signed & acknowledged the presents of: Oliver Woolley
