6th And at my decease and that of my wife. The balance of my Estate of every description not heretofore mentioned, to be equally divided between my several Daughters. That is to say, My Daughters Martha Creasy Sally Agins, Lucy Lewis, Nancy Smith, & Susanna Creasy.

Seventh, And Lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Joseph Creasy, and my son in law William Lewis Jr. Executors of this my last Will & Testament. Herby Revoking all other or former Wills or Testaments by me made. — In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set

of these things, it hath pleased God to bless me with, I make and publish
this my last Will and Testament, as followeth to wit.

First I recommend my Soul to God who gave it and my body to the
Earth to be buried in a decent Christian like manner as my Executive
may think most suitable, and as respects my Estate my will is that
the same be divided in the following manner that is to say.

1st After all my just debt, and funeral expenses are paid, I give &
bequeath to my Mother Nancy Philpott and my two Brothers John
& H. Philpott and Zachariah Philpott my whole Estate to be equally
divided Between them.

2nd I do hereby nominate & appoint my Mother Nancy Philpott Sole Execu-
trix of this my last Will & Testament Containing 2 pages & I do hereby
Revoke, Annul and set aside all former Wills, Codicils, or any other writing
made by me purporting to be a will, herby declaring this to be my last Will
and Testament, and this only, In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my
