Philip Sawsons Will

Know all men by these presents that I Philip
 Sawson of Cumberland County Kentucky being law
 as to health of body but of sound mind and
 memory do make this my last will & Testament
 in the following manner Viz, after the liquidation
 of all of my last debts
 First I Give and bequeath to
 Polly Sawson my Beloved wife the Tract of land
 whereon I now live being one hundred and two
 and one half acres by survey also a part of the
 land adjoining it that I purchased of John Le
 Raper beginning at a forked Poplar above the
 Spring which John Spur Sen marked for a
 corner thence running North according to the course
 called for so far as the Top of the Resin then
 running East according to the line of the tract
 of land on which I now live until it strikes
 the line that runs to my survey of one hundred
 and two and one half acres which tract is
 parcel of land I Give to my aforesaid wife
 Polly Sawson to her and her heirs forever
 Also I have give to my wife a tract of twenty
 acres surveyed for James Lewis and patented
 in my name also 50 acres surveyed and patented
 in my own name adjoining the twenty acre
 survey above named which said tracts of land
 I Give to her and her heirs forever Also I Give
 unto my loving wife all debts owing me which
 have been contracted since and managed together
 into all my stocks of Cash and every description
 and farming utensils with all my house hold
 and kitchen furniture and cloths and every
 wares which property above specified I Give to
 my aforesaid wife her heirs forever
 Whereas I wanted wish to give to
 Mancee Reed a part of my yet unappropriated

Estate however owing to having been informed that Meliam Green intended to commence suit against me for a Negro man named Henry whom I always considered to be my property should I be sued and mulcted in costs and damages I wish what I thereafter disposed of to the benefit of the aforesaid Francis Keen to be applied to the discharging of said debt and damages should any be rendered against me which I am in nowise fearful of if I get Justice I give to Francis Keen and tract of land containing 50 acres which I purchased of Rice & Ramsey also a part of said tract of land which I bought of John C. Roper that is the remainder after my wife having taken her part herein designated also buy off the debt due me and contents entered into previous to my having been married to Pacey Sasser my present wife which I give to him the said Keen and his heirs forever the balance of any demands I have to Pacey my aforesaid living wife to dispose of at her will and pleasure any will or will hereafter made by me is rendered by this my last will and Testament null and void In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 30th day of Decr A.D 1835
