 I do make & publish this my last will & Testament in manner  
 & form following, First that my funeral expences, & all my just  
 debts be paid, then it is my will and desire that some - that all  
 my Ohio land be sold so soon as nature the Lord may admit -  
 and my debts in Ky. be paid, with the proceeds of such sale if my  
 Executors should see it the interest to do so - It is my will and  
 desire that my children, should from the hands my Executor so  
 much schooling in their minority as amounts to a good edu-  
 cation viz. The girls to cypher to the Rule of three, and the Boys to  
 Survey Land - and after paying all my just debts, & educating  
 of my children I give & bequeath all of the remainder of my estate  
 to my beloved wife Nancy Haggard during her widowhood or  
 her natural life and then all the remainder to be equally divi-  
 ded amongst my children namely Nancy, James Shelby, Eliz-  
 abeth and David Rice Haggard - I do hereby appoint my be-  
 loved wife Nancy Haggard Executor and my brother Lury  
 Haggard and Andrew Cassad Executor of this my last will &  
 Testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made - In  
 Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this thir-  
 teenth day of May, in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight  
 hundred & Nineteen - Signed sealed and delivered by the above  
 named Rice Haggard to be his last will & Testament in the  
 presence of us who at his request, and in his presence have here-  
 unto subscribed our names as Witnesses to the same.

well and truly to administer and execute the last will & Testament. The said Reuben Parsons one of the Executors of the last will & Testament of Rice Haggard deceased, being solemnly affirmed well & faithfully to administer the same & to make & Exhibit a true & perfect Inventory of all and several of the said goods, Chattels, & Credits, and in all things well & faithfully to execute the same - And also to render a just account of his transactions when thereunto required - In Testimony whereof I Samuel Gibbs Clerk of the said Court of Common Pleas have hereunto set my hand, & official seal, the seal of our said Court, affixed at Columbus in the County of Champaigne aforesaid, hereby certify the truth of the copy of said will, and the proceeding aforesaid - this tenth day of September 20. 1819

In the name of God Amen the 5<sup>th</sup> day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & nineteen I Michael Johnston of Cumberland County Kentucky being in a low state of health but in perfect memory thanks be to God for the same & calling to mind the mortality of men and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die. Do make and ordain this my last will & Testament that is to say principally and first of all - I give & recommend my soul in the hands of God that gave it and for my body I recommend it to the earth to be buried in a Christian manner at the direction of my Executors and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me within this life I give divide and dispose of the same in manner & form following that is to say in the first place I give and bequeath to my dearly beloved wife Elisabeth Johnston the plantation whereon I do live containing 10 1/2 acres of land and if my wife shall think proper to have the said land sold for my Executors to make a note to the purchaser and my wife to have the money to purchase more land and if she should not purchase land at her death for the money received for the land to be divided betwixt my two sons Michael Johnston & Richard Johnston; and if the land is not sold for it at my wife's death to be divided equally betwixt the above named Michael & Richard Johnston also by my desire that my wife have all my stock house hold & kitchen furniture, to have & to hold so long as my wife Elisabeth Johnston should live; and it is my desire that my wife may see so much of the stock as she may think proper as to raise one hundred & thirty Dollars, and
