In the name of God Amen I Robert Crockett of the County of Cumberland and State of Kentucky being advanced in years and weak in body but sound in mind and memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with I do hereby make this my last will and Testament I desire that hee. of the Personal Property of my estate be immediately sold after my decease and out of the money arising therefrom all my Just debts and funeral expenses be paid and the balance if any to be divided between my children and Nephews William Crockett Eliza Doxey Mary Travis and David Crockett secondly I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Jane Kighan a Certain Negro Girl named Rachel to have and to hold forever Thirdly having been called upon to pay debts for my said Wife as his security to Lewis Duval I do Give and bequeath the same to him as his full share of all my estate except the provisions I have made for him in the division of my Personal estate Fourthly I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Doxey a Negro Girl named Paddy to have and to hold forever Fifthly I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Travis and Negro Girl named Anne to have and to hold forever Sixthly I Give and bequeath to my son David and Negro boy named Sam to have and to hold forever

seventhly I Give and bequeath to my son James Crockett and Negro Girl named Lucy to have and to hold forever

Eighthly I Give and bequeath to my son Robt Crockett and Negro Girl named Nancy to have and to hold forever

Ninthly I Give & bequeath to my sons James & Robt Crockett the tract of land whereon I now live to be equally divided between them & I also request that my son James shall have the upper part of said tract & my son Robt to have the lower part so as to include the dwelling house

which said tracts of land the aforesaid James & Robt are to have and to hold during their natural life & at their death the aforesaid tracts of land to fall to the legal heirs of the aforesaid Jas & Robt

herewith agreeable to the foregoing division which said
 have or such of them as may be to have and
 to hold as an Inalienable Inheritance forever
