

In the name of God Amen Know all men by these presents that I Robert Parrott of the County of Cumberland and state of Virginia knowing that it is decreed that all men shall see and being of sound and sober mind do make and publish this as and for my last will and testament hereby revoking and annulling all former wills by me made. and giving this all the force and effect, that writings of this description paper Item 1st I will & bequeath unto my daughter Nancy Willis wife of the late Reubin Willis de'd the sum of three hundred & fifty dollars which when she shall have received she will have no further claim to my estate she having received her full proportion therein negroes & other property Item 2nd I will & bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Waggoner wife of the late James Waggoner de'd the sum of two hundred & fifty dollars which when she shall have received she will have no further demand or interest in my estate she having received her full proportion therein in negroes & other property Item 3rd I will & bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Waggoner wife of John Waggoner the sum of four hundred dollars which when she shall have received she will have no further interest in my estate she having received her full proportion therein in negroes & other property Item 4th I will and bequeath that my daughter Mary Waggoner wife of Thomas Waggoner have no further interest in my estate she having heretofore received her full proportion therein in negroes & other property Item 5th I will & bequeath that my daughter Auee Paynel wife of William Paynel have no further interest in my estate she having received her full proportion therein in negroes & other property Item 6th I will & bequeath unto my daughter in law Frances Parrott wife of my son Oliver Parrott a negro girl named Betty my trunk & all its contents excepting useful papers to be disposed of as she may think proper Item 7th I will & bequeath unto my grand daughter Elizabeth Mc Hopkins wife of Joseph Mc Hopkins the sum of four hundred dollars to be paid to her when collected, Item 8th I will and bequeath unto my grand daughter Eleanor B Miller wife of Edmund T Miller the sum of one hundred & fifty dollars to be paid to him when collected, Item 9th my will & desire is that my negro woman Lucy shall be emancipated Item tenth I will and bequeath unto my son Oliver Parrott all the remainder of my estate of every kind whatsoever which has not been disposed of otherwise heretofore & in this will which onsets in the following description to wit Sam & Esther his wife Maria Jane Frank Amanda Sylvia & Lonow who are negro slaves, one thousand dollars in an apupent of Isaac Miller, of the state of Virginia to me six horses two waggons & gear my bed and stool & furniture, cloth one large family bible to have & to hold to him and his heirs forever lastly I do nominate & appoint my son Oliver Parrott & George Burgoe my friends as executors to this my last will & testament, to do & have done & performed all the commands therein given, In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 29th day of April 1829 & 29 year of the Commonwealth, signed sealed & in presence of
