

In the Name of God amen I Samuel Biggerstaff
 being very sick and weak in body, but of perfect
 mind and disposing memory, thanks be to God
 and calling to mind the uncertainty of this life
 and that all men must yield to death, when it
 comes, do make, ordain, constitute and appoint
 this my last will and testament, hereby disannulling
 all former wills, heretofore by me made, and de-
 claring this and no other my last will and
 testament. And for the settling my temporal
 affairs, that it has pleased God to bless me with
 and give and bequeath in the manner and form
 following, that is, first my soul to God who gave it, and
 my body to be buried in a decent Christian burial at
 the discretion of my son William Biggerstaff, who I
 hereby appoint my executor - I give and bequeath
 to my beloved wife Mary Biggerstaff, the land and
 plantation whereon I now live, also the half of a
 two hundred acre survey of land, laying on the north
 side of the river, the own half adjoining the river, which
 I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Biggerstaff
 during her natural life, and at her death to descend to
 my son William Biggerstaff, which plantation and
 lands I give to him in consequence of his attendance to my
 business in my old age - I also give and bequeath to my
 wife Mary Biggerstaff, every article and species of
 property with its increase, that she was possessed of,
 when I married her, to be hers absolutely, and at her
 own disposition, and chose of such of my negroes
 as she may think proper, during her natural life,
 also all my household and kitchen furniture,
 farming utensils, with all species of stock, during
 her life, and at her death to be sold and equally
 divided among such of my children and grand children
 as shall name to wit, the heirs of Moses Biggerstaff,
 the heirs of Hiram Biggerstaff and my sons Samuel
 Biggerstaff, Aaron Biggerstaff, Mallis Biggerstaff, Benjamin
 Biggerstaff, John Biggerstaff and David Biggerstaff, my
 sons one eighth part of the money arising from the sale of
 the before named, all the ballance of my property except a
 bed and furniture, which I give and bequeath to my son
 Benjamin Biggerstaff, after my just debts are paid, to be
 sold and divided equally among the before mentioned viz,
 Moses Biggerstaffs heirs, Hiram Biggerstaffs heirs and my
 sons Samuel Biggerstaff, Aaron Biggerstaff, Mallis

29th Biggestaff, of the Biggestaffs, Benjamin Biggestaff and David Biggestaff - with regard to my son Wallis Biggestaff everything herein intended for him, shall only be paid out to him by the agreement of my executor, and two other good men, or such men as my executor shall think proper to chuse, and if they are of the opinion that he should receive it in small sums, then to be paid -

It is my particular request that my son William Biggestaff shall continue and live on the plantation with my wife, may and have complete jurisdiction over the negroes which my wife may make choice of, and attend to the plantation affairs, and continue to do her business, as he may think proper, so long as she or he may live - with some erasures and interlinings -
