Also a judgment in Salisbury Court, North Carolina against Jeremiah Wade Esq for five or six hundred dollars, I know not the particular amount, I leave to Richard Wade, provided he shall see fit to collect said judgment - if not any other of the legated, may collect it for their own use, I leave as the executors of this my will, William B. Root, Isaac McDevie, Edward Clark and George P. Harland, any one or more of them,
