The Non-Testamentary Will of Samuel Elliott deceased, late of said County, Kentucky, when in his last sickness and under full prospect of his dissolution, at the own house on the 11th day of January in the year of our Lord 1872 in the presence of Joseph Witham and William Weather, whom the Testator called upon and made to be testamentary executors, & the manner in which he wished to dispose of his worldly substance being in his proper mind he said "My last will and testament shall be an equal division of all my property and worth, real and personal, and I directed my wife should receive and have thereof then & in that case my will is that her children which she has by me shall be divided of their portion and shall not receive less than one hundred and fifty dollars each. Also if any of the Executors should be dissatisfied with this my will and should try to break it by the matter of controversy to three, five or seven men to decide who were to be chosen by my Executors, and if a proper such decision being had, he who was thus contenting and not abiding by the said decision shall not receive from my estate, less than one hundred dollars each. And I do appoint George Elliott, Joseph Elliott & James Carter to be the Executors to this my last will." The above Non-Testamentary Will was reduced to writing from the mouth of the witness aforesaid named the 17th day of January 1872.


