with whom I have long lived and still live and inhabit all my house hold  
and kitchen furniture cupboard furniture three beds and furniture  
3<sup>rd</sup> I have Deeds one tomb and spinning wheel and pair Still yards two wear-  
ing slaps and one note on James Boyd for sixty dollars due and paya-  
ble the 1<sup>st</sup> of October 1837 if not collected before my death one note  
on William M. Daniels for \$40 Silver payable and due the 3<sup>rd</sup> of  
December 1836 if not collected before my decease and 1 Judgement  
on Jacob Robertson for \$66<sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> dollars Silver with the principal with the legal  
interest if not collected before my death I should the foregoing notes &  
judgement be collected before my decease I desire that said Susanna  
have the whole or so much thereof as may be still in my possession at my  
decease which is to go to pay my debts and funeral expenses and should
