In the Name of God amen I William Anderson of Cumberland County Kentucky do make and ordain this my last will & Testament being made in body but of sound mind as follows to wit first my desire is that all my just debts be paid out of my estate second my will and desire is that all the Personal property is to be sold & one Piece of Land the Place called the riggs Place containing fifty acres and the balance of my Land to be rented out, and my beloved wife Nancy is to be supported out of the Proceeds of the same, the overplusk of the money raised for the sale of my Property I wish to be Equally divided among my Children namely Eliza Elizabeth John Sally James Polly & William, For when it is so soon as they become of age of 21 years the money to be loaned out on interest untill each of aforesaid shall become of age and at the death of my beloved wife, I want my Land to be sold & the Proceeds to be Equally divided among my heirs aforesaid, If any of my Children die before they severally arrive to the age of 21 my will is that their Portion be divided equally among those that are living Lastly my will & desire is that John Cas & William Barry be appointed Executors of this my last will and Testament Given under my hand this 30 of April 1833
