 this my last will and testament in manner and form following
 I give and bequeath unto my wife Martha Bristow all my personal
 estate, goods and chattels of what kind and nature soever, to have
 and to hold with full power and authority, during her natural
 life, and after her death, I will unto my son John Bristow my
 land which I now live on with one bed and furniture, all the
 rest and residue of my estate to be sold, and equally divided
 between my heirs, and then after the death of my said son John, my
 land to be also sold and divided among the heirs. In witness whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand and seal on the 10th day of May
 in the year 1800.
