William Baker's Will

William Baker of Cumberland County Kentucky, do make and Ordain this my last will & Testament in manner & form as follows

I give my daughter Judith Min one horse best Saddle, one Cow & Calf, one bed & furniture, all of which she having heretofore recd.

I give to my daughter Polly Carter, one horse best, one Saddle, one Cow & Calf & one bed & furniture, all of which she having heretofore received.

I give to my daughter Virginia White, one horse best, one Saddle, one Cow & Calf, one bed & furniture, all of which she having heretofore received.

I give to my son Eliazer C. Baker one negro boy named Hodgson, one boy mare, one Cow & Calf, one bed and furniture, all of which he having heretofore received, except the negro.

I give to my son Martin Baker, one negro boy named Sathan one Black Mare's filly, one Cow & Calf one bed & furniture, none of which he has received.

I give to my son Samuel A. Baker, one negro boy named Obediah, one boy mare, one Cow & Calf, one bed & furniture, all of which he having heretofore received, except the negro.

I give to my daughter Hannah Baker, one negro girl named Mary, one Sorrel horse called Whip, one Cow & Calf, one bed & furniture and my bureau, none of which she has received.

And it is my will & desire that my daughter Hannah, shall have the free privilege to live in my mansion house, during her natural life, or as long as she may live single.

I give to my three sons, Martin, Eliazer C. & Samuel A. Baker, the tract of land on which I now live, together with my undivided interest held in the Mill with its appurtenances (with my Brothers John and James Baker) to be equally divided between them, according to quantity & quality, to be paid off and divided in such manner, that Samuel A. take the place on which I now live, and Eliazer C. the place on which he now lives, and Martin the balance, to them & their heirs forever.

It is my will & desire that three negro women, not heretofore disposed of named Levisa, Louisa & Catherine be valued & divided amongst my three daughters namely, Judith Min, Polly Carter and Virginia White in the following manner, that is to say I give to my daughter Judith the one third to her and her heirs forever -

I give to my daughter Polly the one third to her & her heirs forever

To my daughter Virginia, I lend in trust in the hands of Martin, Eliazer C. & Samuel A. Baker for her use and benefit the one third with its increase, during her natural life, and at her death I give the same to the heirs of said Virginia forever.

The last named third subject to the Order, Control and disposition of said Trustees, at any time and in any way, they shall think fit and proper, but especially for the use and benefit of said Virginia, during her life as aforesaid.

It is also my will and desire that my two negro men named Frank & Dick shall remain here with my sons Martin, Eliazer C. & Samuel M. Baker, so long as they live and behave themselves well, but should they not do so, they have the privilege to hire them out, or dispose of them as they may think proper, so as not to part them from their wives.

It is my will & desire, that the balance of my estate not heretofore specifically disposed of (excepting my Cart and Steers which I now give to my three sons Martin, Eliazer C. & Samuel M. Baker) be sold to the highest bidder, on such Credit as my executors shall think proper, and out of the proceeds of the same, I give to my four grand children being the heirs of my Son William G. Baker deceased namely Millard H., Francis P. William C. & Samuel M. Baker the sum of Sixty dollars each & direct my said executors to pay the same over to them accordingly - but in case of the death of either of said Children, before they arrive at mature age, that Childs part to remain where it now is.

It is my will & desire that should there not be a sufficiency of my property sold, to give to the four last mentioned Children, the Sixty dollars apiece, that my three sons Martin, Eliazer C. & Samuel M. Baker make up that amount to them, and in case there is an excess in the hands of my executors after paying the Sixty dollars each and themselves for their services & trouble, that the same be equally divided between all my Children;

I do hereby nominate and appoint my friend Robert Drummond & my son Martin Baker Executors of this my last will & testament, hereby revoking all other former wills by me made.
