And personal for the term of her natural life if she should continue a widow - To my son Frederick Johnston I give and bequeath one horse bridle and saddle worth one hundred and twenty five dollars which he has already received To my son Thomas Johnston I give and bequeath one horse worth one hundred dollars together with a saddle and bridle worth twenty two dollars which he has already rec^d I give and bequeath to my sons Mayes Mores Andrew & Currens Johnston and to my daughter Ashley Johnston each one horse head worth one hundred dollars together with a bridle and saddle worth twenty two dollars I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Hill one saddle worth twenty two dollars. I make no mention of ~~the part of~~ my other heirs because I have heretofore given them as much or more than I have bequeathed to those mentioned above. My will and desire is that these several legacies be paid as the respective legates become of age if my wife and one of the other executors of this my last will and testament should be of opinion that the same could be done without injuring my other heirs who may then be minors -

I also will that at the decease of my wife Louanna Johnston the whole of my estate that she may then be in possession of be equally divided among my heirs alive at this time or their legal representatives. But if my wife Louanna Johnston should marry again my will is that my whole estate be divided among my heirs mentioned above or their legal representatives agreeably to the laws of the state of Kentucky. Lastly I constitute and appoint my dearly beloved wife Louanna Johnston and my son Frederick Johnston and Adam Stirlington executors and executors of this my will and testament In witness of all and each of the things herein contained I have set my hand and seal this twenty third day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three
