 and live in all my house hold and kitchen furniture, and
 in case of short crop before the crop should be finished
 it is my will and desire that my son Thomas should have
 all that part of my crop which is now growing on the
 North side of the River Cumberland and that my son William
 should have all that part of which is on the South side

and I do hereby Enjoin it on my son William to maintain
 his mother along as she lives; lastly I do hereby appoint my sons
 Edward, Thomas and William to be my Executors to this
 my last Will and Testament according to all and well they may
