I William Smith of the County of Cumberland and
 State of Kentucky Being of sound mind and memory
 but advanced in age & taking into consideration the uncertainty
 of life & certainty of death and wishing to make a disposition
 of my worldly goods & belongings before I depart this life
 Do make constitute ordain and publish this writing to be
 my last will and Testament in manner and form following
 hereby revoking & disannulling all other wills & Testaments by me
 hitherto made. First I give unto my Beloved wife Elizabeth
 the Tracts of land whereon I now live for and during her natural
 life and at her death to pass I may hereinafter devise also the
 following negroes David old Ben old Julius little Isaac their
 Simanpeter Jack Elizabeth & her increase & Henry all of my
 house hold and kitchen furniture stock of every description
 such as may be herein after otherwise disposed of all of my
 farming utensils all of my shop tools of every description

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my books of every kind & all of my money if any should be
left in my house all bonds notes or outstanding debts after
paying all of my Just debts & Justice Expenses to hold
ascendancy & enjoy in any way she may chuse for her maintenance
for and during her natural life & with full power to dispose
of all said Property except the land & such other resources as
are hereinafter made by her last will and Testament to her
any of my children or Grand children as she may collect or
choose. It is however my will that should she die before she has
share live with which one my children they may choose
after the death of my wife & should they survive her should
my wife leave no issue it is then my will that what I have
left her may be divided among my Grand children then living
that is to say the children of Susan Mc White as one legatee
the children of Polly Mc Barnes as one legatee Nathaniel
Smiths three youngest children as one legatee Elizabeth
Blacks two daughters as one legatee to which said portions
to which their parents would be entitled to when they are
living & a division took place amongst them

Secondly I Give and bequeath unto my Grand children
Kearney Smith Francis Smith & Elizabeth Smith the following
tracts of land lying adjoining together below where I now live on
Lumberland river one containing two hundred acres called the
Calloway tract one containing one hundred and fifty acres
military land also one other tract I purchased of Nathan
Sherman whose Daniel Woodruff did live containing
seventy five the three tracts making in all four hundred &
twenty five acres & should I purchase the land whereon Hoag
Murphy now lives it is my will that it be added to the above
four hundred & 25 acres thereby making the quantity of 300
hundred acres Given by me to said Grand children Kearney
Smith & Elizabeth Smith but should I not purchase the
same it is my will that three hundred and fifty dollars
be taken out of any money that may be due or in hand to my
Estate that my Executors hereafter named may purchase said
Murphy tract for the purpose aforesaid of being added
to the tracts as above making the said quantity of 300
acres to pay by this will to my said Grand children above named
Kearney Smith Francis Smith & Polly Smith to them and
their heirs forever but should said Murphy tract not be
purchased either by myself or my Executors the above named Grand
children last mentioned are to be entitled to the said sum of
\$330 & I also Give and bequeath unto said Kearney
Smith Francis Smith & Elizabeth Smith the following negroes
Daisy & her three youngest children Andrew Jim & Mary and
their increase to them and their heirs forever & as I had Given
to my son Nathaniel Smith in his life time two negroes men
Oley Daisy & his widow being entitled to a life estate in said negroes
being one third I purchased said interest for the benefit of
the four legates or heirs at law of my son Nathaniel
Smith deceased one of said heirs being Susan intermarried

intermarried with Aaron Headland & as they the said Headland & Susan were determined to see their interest in the said two Negro men Olly & Darry I purchased it for the benefit of my said three Grandchildren Harriette (Frances) & Elizabeth Smith it is therefore my will and desire & they are hereby vested with all the interest to which I am entitled in an to the said Negroes Olly & Darry by my former purchase being intended by me as fully for the benefit of said three Grand Children last above mentioned

But should either of said three last mentioned Grand Children depart this life without lawful issue of their body it is my will that the survivors enjoy the benefit of the above Bequest & what I may hereafter bequeath to them the said three mentioned Grand Children Thirdly I Give & Bequeath unto my Daughter Susanna White & Barnett White her husband all my Tracts of land lying on the south side of Cumberland river that I purchased of Robert Alvey & Nezechiah Ellington containing five hundred & twenty or there to be occupied & enjoyed by them during their natural lives and at their death to go to the children of said Barnett White & Susanna White his wife & their heirs forever

Also I Give and bequeath unto the said Barnett White and Susanna his wife the following negroes to wit Lewis and Betty and all the increase that said Betty now has or may hereafter have to them and their heirs forever having loaned to said Barnett White the sum of \$546 it is my will & desire that he be acquitted & discharged from any claim for or an account of said loaned money but that the same be considered as given to him by me and taken into consideration in the division of my property in this will as so much received by him in way of advancement

Fourthly I Give and Bequeath unto my son in law James Clark one Negroe man named Strank to him and his heirs forever I also Bequeath to him the use & profit of the farm whereon I now live containing five hundred & fifty five acres of land during his natural life from and after the death of my wife and after the death of said Clark then said Tract of land with its appurtenances to vest in fee simple in my two Grand Children Nancy Francis Clark & Elizabeth Susan Smith Clark daughters of James Clark & Elizabeth Clark deceased to them my two last mentioned Grand Children & their heirs forever I also give and Bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Nancy Francis Clark one Negroe Girl named Suey & her increase after the decease of my wife to her & her heirs forever I also give unto Elizabeth Susan Smith Clark one Negroe Girl named Sarah & her increase after the death of wife to her and her heirs forever I also lend my Negroe woman Aggy & her increase she now has and may hereafter have to James Clark during his life from and after the decease of my wife and at his death I will and Bequeath them to pass to his daughters before named Nancy Francis Clark Elizabeth Susan Smith Clark to them & their heirs forever I also Bequeath to James Clark for and during his life about eighty acres of land lying on Cumberland river opposite to where I now live & after the decease of James Clark then to his two daughters above named to them & their

Sixthly I Give and bequeath unto James Gaine & Mary the
 Gaine his wife all the Tracts of Land they now live on formerly
 occupied by John M. Simper containing six hundred and 30
 acres in different surveys adjoining each other far and near their
 lots & at their deaths to go to the children of the said James
 Gaine by his said wife Mary the Gaine & to their heirs forever
 I also give and bequeath unto said James Gaine & Mary the
 Gaine this wife the following Negroes to wit, one woman named
 Biddy & her three children Orinow Daniel & Lucia with their
 increase to them and their heirs forever

Seventhly I Give and bequeath unto to my
 Grand son Charles William Smith All the Tract of Land lying
 on Deer Creek that I purchased of Eley level containing five
 hundred acres to be rented out yearly by my Executors and
 the profits arising therefrom to be appropriated in educating
 him my said Grand son Also I Give and bequeath unto him one
 Negro boy named George one Girl called Little Lucy daughter
 of Bury & one Negro Girl named Becky daughter of John
 also one thousand dollars out of any money belonging to my
 estate to be paid out on interest for his benefit whether he
 arrives to the age of twenty one years but should said Charles
 William Smith die before arrive to the age of 21 years
 or without lawfull issue of his body then in either of these
 events said Property Land Slaves & money bequeathed to him
 shall revert back to my Estate & be holdiana part thereof
 and be equally divided & distributed according to law among
 my heirs children and Grand children herein named

Eighthly I Give and bequeath unto my Grand
 son William White one Negro boy named Rubin to him
 said William White his heirs forever This devise is made
 by me in compliance and wish of my Daughter Steiny Smith
 deceased to whom I intended to give said Negro boy &
 had so made known to her who in her last illness requested
 him to be given to my said Grand son William White
 which to her I declared I would do and in every respect
 comply with her wish in relation to the property which
 had been set apart for him

Ninthly I will and bequeath
 unto my wife all the remainder of the Property of whatever
 kind the same may not be disposed of in this my last
 will and Testament to use and enjoy & dispose of as she may
 think fit during her natural life & at her death to be equally
 divided among my children & Grand children according to
 law regulating distributing of Estates

Tenthly It is my will that all the furniture that
 my children took with them when they married & left me they
 shall keep as their own & hold in name & vicinity should
 any part of this will appear not to be understood hereby
 by any of my legates they are not to go to law but are to
 raise the disputed points to James Baker sen & John Baker
 & in the case they cannot be set to him men whom my Executors

may choose & in the event of their not choosing and a dispute
as aforesaid should arise then the Judge of the Cumberland
Circuit Court to appoint two men to make such decision
which shall be binding on all Parties
