 First, After bequeathing my soul to God, who gave it; and my body to its mother dust; do wish my estate to be disposed of as followeth - Wiz -

That at first all my personal estate be set up and sold to the highest bidder, and after the payment of all my just debts the balance of the money arising from the sale of said estate to be divided as followeth - Wiz - First, To my well beloved wife Eleanor Groce, one third of the balance after debt and other expenses paid; the balance to be equally divided between my five children - to-wiz John, Henry, William, David and Polly Groce, when they shall come of age - My request is further that my four sons be in the care of Joseph Perkins for the purpose of seeing that they are put to suitable places to be clothed and reared till they arrive of age to choose their Guardians; and do hereby appoint Joseph Perkins as my administrator to see that this my will is executed according to my request -
