following that is to say
1st I desire that all my Just debts be paid as well as my funeral expenses
Out of the monies which may be due me at my decease if there should
be some what due if not then the perishable property or so much thereof
as will satisfy said expenses and debts to be sold to satisfy same
2^{dly} After the payment of my debts and expenses I give to Susanna Kayser
with whom I have long lived and still live and inhabit all my house hold
and kitchen furniture cupboard furniture three beds and furniture
3rd I have Sings one tomb and spinning wheel and pair Still yards two wear-
ing slaps and one note on James Boyd for sixty dollars due and paya-
ble the 1st of October 1837 if not collected before my death one note
on William M. Daniels for \$40 Silver payable and due the 3rd of
December 1836 if not collected before my decease and 1 Judgement
on Jacob Robertson for \$66²/₃ dollars Silver with the principal with the legal
interest if not collected before my death I should the foregoing notes &
judgement be collected before my decease I desire that said Susanna
have the whole or so much thereof as may be still in my possession at my
decease which is to go to pay my debts and funeral expenses and should
there be more money than will satisfy said debts and funeral expenses
I give the over plus to said Susanna and should there not remain as
much in my possession at my decease as would satisfy my Just debts
and funeral expenses of said notes then my perishable property to be sold
to satisfy the balances of my debts and funeral expenses also I give
said Susanna one third part of my crop of Corn and tobacco which is
and was made the last summer season or remains not disposed of
at my decease also one Sould mare named baldank and one
third part of my cattle sheep and hogs also my Blacks with tools
3^{dly} I give to my Recognized Son known by the name of Hardin
of Hardin Twpel who was born of of the body of the above named
Susanna Kunnels whilst living and inhabiting with me one
Sould mare named Soule with with her last Colt and one Sould


philly one year old Cattle Spring and one third part of Cattle

 dollars one Gray mare one daniel philly 2 year old last Spring
 2 lead mounted Rifle guns and one shot pouch and powder
 horn one third part of my cattle sheep and hogs one half of my
 farming utensils 2 books Saladmitts works and 1 old sea ggon and
 one third part of my present crop of corn and tobacco

thly and all the rest of my Estate both real and personal of what
 nature or kind so ever they may be not herein before particularly dis
 posed of I desire may be equally divided among the above named

Heardie & William my Recognized sons which I give to them their
 heirs and assigns for ever & lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint
 the above named Susanna Reynolds my executrix of this my last will
 and testament & devise that she may not be bound in security
 hereby revoking all former wills and testaments by me made
 I have here unto set my hand and seal this the 19th of Dec
 1827
