In pursuance of an order of the County Court of Cumberland County of their June term 1828 we William Wood James Harper & Elijah Hopkins being first sworn have at the dwelling house of Robert Cross Esq in the aforesaid County on the 6th day of September 1828 proceeded to State and settle the account current with the administrators of the estate of William Fogg Deceased

1st on the certified copy from the clerks office of the Inventory of appraisement including all the items of the first part previous to the mention of the note on Hugh French for \$60 we find the amount of the appraised values to be \$489.87½ and we also in comparing the sale list with the aforesaid list of appraisement and the items contained in each find each appraised item to have been sold except one pair of steele yards appraised to \$1.50 two knives and a punch appraised to \$1.00 one hammer drawing knife Dangers and one chair and ten hogs & calves which were valued with other articles and therefore their value not known we also find the following articles sold which were not appraised to wit

1 pair saddle bags for \$1.00 two head steds for 50 cents 1 lb Hammon \$2.00 one horse least \$5 one ass \$1.62.5 one horse \$1.25 two pair cards 25 cents one ass \$1.76.0 and lock 50 cents

we find the amount of the sale including the last mentioned articles which were not appraised to be \$432.29.7 we are also

informed that one Clevis and the drawing knife were sold in the item in the sale list called a lot of tools and 3 calves were sold with the cows their mothers which is omitted to be

recited in the sale list and that four hogs were used for the support of the family after their appraisement and that the remaining six hogs were absent on the day of sale and not sold

the first place I allow all my estate both real and personal to be valued by two
Judicious and Intersted men chosen by my executors for that purpose and as for my
negroes I do not wish them to be sold from my family of children thereof shall
dispose of them in the following manner that is I give and bequeath to my Daughter
Sarah Brooks my negre woman named Lucy and her largest child named
herlina at their value to be settled in her part of my estate also I give and bequeath
to my daughter Nancy Bryson a negre boy named Elford and a negre
girl named Hiza at their value to be settled in her part of my estate I also
give and bequeath to my son in law William Hamrah my negre man
named Ben at his value to be settled in his part of my estate then all the
balance of my estate both real and personal I allow to be sold on a
Credit of 12 months and the money arising from such I shall dispose
off in the following manner that is to say first I allow all just debts
and demands against me to be settled and paid and I give and
bequeath to my 2 grand Daughters the heirs of my son Charles Whitlock
Deceased Two dollars in full of their part of my estate then the balance
and remainder of the money arising from the sale of my Estate
and one hundred dollars in silver which I have to my son in law
John Hammons and all other debts due to me I allow to be divided
Equally to my three daughters Sarah Brooks Nancy Bryson and
Milly Bush and to my two son in laws William Hamrah and John
Hammons all which is to receive an equal part of the money from the
Sale and the other debts due to me Counting the value and price of
the negroes in their part of my estate to whom they are Bequeathed Likewise
do constitute make and ordain benge Dwope and William Wood
Gentlemen sole executors of this my last will and testament I do hereby
utterly dis allow revoke and disannul every former will and testament
ratifying and confirming this alone and no other to be to be my
my last will and testament in witness where of I have here unto set my
hand and seal this 22^d of January 1824
