

I William Hoops senior of the County of Cumberland
and state of Kentucky, being afflicted in body but of a
sound mind, do by these presents this 28th day of October
in the year of our Lord 1814 make this my last will
and testament; In the first place, I desire that my
body may be buried in decency, and I commend my
spirit to God who gave it in hopes of a resurrection to life
through ^{eternal} Jesus Christ - And in the second place I

bequeath unto my daughters Sally, Nancy and Mary Cook
 at any death fifty shillings out of the stocks of horses I leave to
 be equally divided between them: and in the third place
 I bequeath unto my beloved wife Polly all the residue of my
 property both real and personal during her life, and after her
 death I leave my land and property to be equally divided
 amongst all my children, and I do hereby revoke and for ever
 disannul and revoke any other will, and declare this to
 be my last will and testament; In witness whereof I have
